# Dear Friends

This past July, the Child Protection Center celebrated another year of service- a year of inspiring advocacy from our community, a year of healing for our clients, and a year of strengthening our fight against child abuse. As we look back over the past fiscal year, we must also look towards the future, as many of our recent milestones have been significant moments of growth that will bring life-saving services to more clients than ever before.

The year began with the tremendous news that CPC earned accreditation from the National Children's Alliance following an extensive application and site review process. This is a remarkable feat of national recognition, as accreditation is the highest level of membership and denotes excellence in service provision.

Additional excitement quickly followed in December when we closed on a beautiful new building and property in North Port. The need for this expansion became increasingly apparent as North Port's population grew 213% from 2000-2020 with almost 1/4 of that population being school aged children and adolescents. This drastic growth led to an increased need for CPC's child abuse services, which was even further exacerbated by the pandemic. We are extremely pleased to share that following renovations, therapy sessions and intervention services through the Child Protection Team and Supervised Visitation Program have been fully launched at this location. This is an enormous stepping stone for CPC and our community as it provides better access to our services for families in South County, with even bigger plans for the future.

The pattern of growth continued in April when we announced plans for Hanna's Hope, an expansion of CPC's therapy program for adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse. This program is named in honor of Karen and Mike Valentino and their dream of creating a place of healing for survivors of abuse. Karen's sister Johanna, or Hanna, was a remarkably brave survivor of child sexual abuse who faced severe struggles in adulthood without access to such treatment programs.

By the close of the fiscal year, CPC had also seen weighty internal growth. New additions to our therapy team made it possible for the waitlist of verified victims of child abuse in need of therapy, which at its peak during the pandemic had 70+ names, to be reduced to 2. Meanwhile, our prevention program has been preparing for the milestone anniversary of 30 years of educating the community on reducing child abuse as well as an upcoming initiative to expand into DeSoto County.

As you can see, it's been quite a year at the Child Protection Center! It is thanks to you, the passionate supporters of our mission, that each of these feats has been accomplished. We know that even more progress lies ahead and we're truly thankful to have you with us on this journey of changing lives and bringing hope to our children.

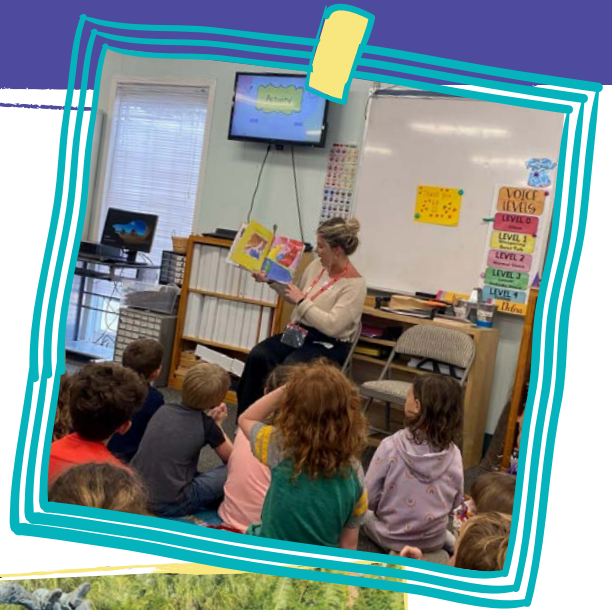

PSCA provides primary abuse prevention from pre-school through high school. The program also facilitates workshops for their caregivers, teachers, school board staff, and community members to empower children and enable adults to help make our entire community a safer and more stable place for children and families.

# Intervention

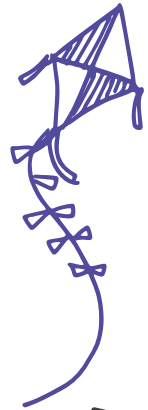
## Children and Families Supervised Visitation Program (CFSVP)

CFSVP provides a safe, stress-free, caring environment where a non-custodial parent and their child/children can interact under the watchful eye of a highly trained volunteer. The intent of this program is to foster a healthy relationship with both parents, as research has shown this connection improves the overall wellbeing and stability of the child. Over 50 Sarasota County residents serve as CFSVP volunteers.



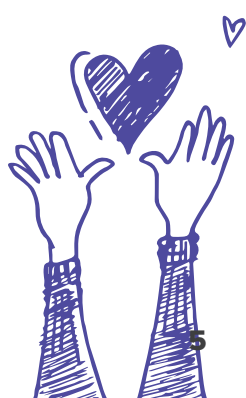

# Intervention

## Child Protection Team (CPT)

CPT is legislatively mandated and works with the DCF and local law enforcement on the cases of children who are suspected victims of physical & sexual abuse, and neglect. This devoted team facilitates critically important forensic interviews, psychological & medical assessments, and court testimonies. CPT is the only provider authorized to perform these functions in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties.

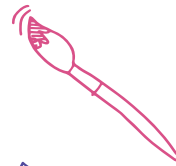
# Treatment

## Therapy Programs SATP & KKP

Therapy Programs consists of the Sexual Abuse Treatment Program (SATP) and the Kid Kindness Program (KKP), both designed to serve children who have been physically and/or sexually abused, those children exhibiting problematic sexual behaviors, and their non-offending caregivers and siblings. These pivotal programs provide free mental health support with the goal of restoring health, development, and safety among victims and their families as they heal from the trauma of abuse.

He gestured to a large stack of papers and said they had 55 cases in the past week. 55 cases. More than seven a day. That blew me away.”

As stated above, the Sacks are moved to their astounding generosity by a shared wish: to make the world a better place. As said by Bridgett Miller, a speaker on parenting with intention, “You don’t need to try and change the whole world, just change one child’s world for the better and the ripples that follow will lead to change in the world.” The world of each and every child who walks through CPC’s doors has been bettered by Skip and Gail, sending innumerable ripples and building a world of hope, health, and happiness. 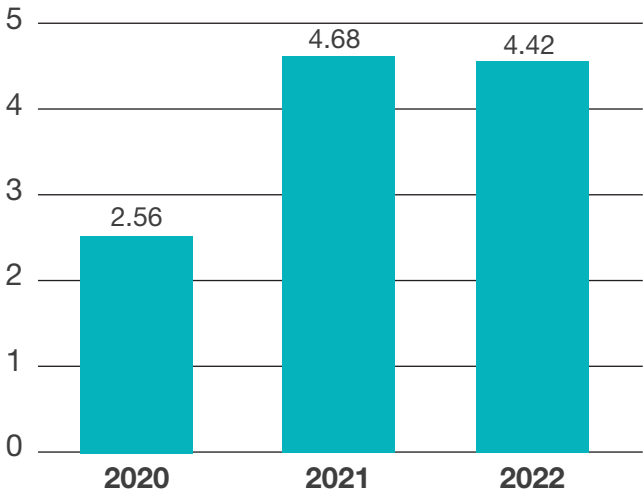

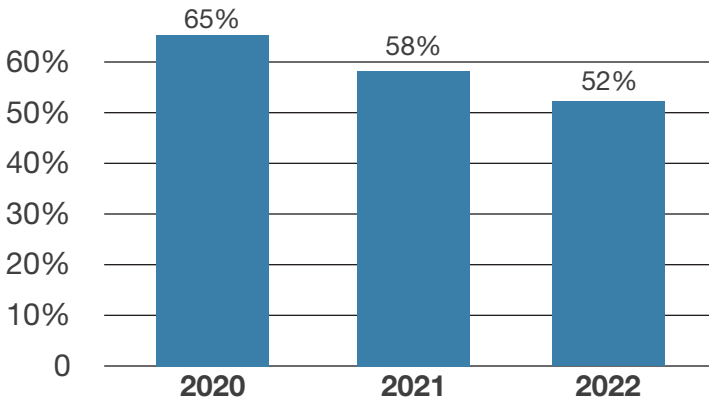
# Revenues by Source



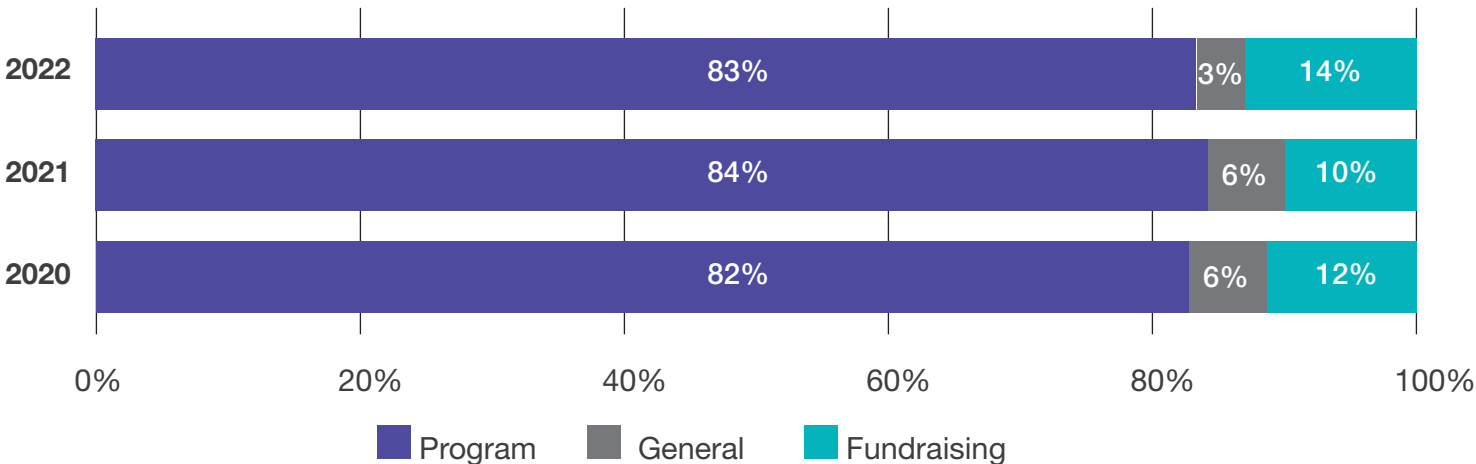
## Fundraising Efficiency
