I resolved to make a difference for children and to protect their right to a childhood of safety. The Child Protection Center has helped me to make that difference.

After touring the Center, we saw first-hand how passionate, determined and committed the entire organization is to making a difference. In the years since, we have grown into ardent supporters, providing financial support and then deepening our involvement through serving on event committees and eventually as Chair of the Board of Directors. It brings me unspeakable comfort and joy to know that our actions impact children in our very own community and protect them from traumas like my own.

A Brief History of the Child Protection Center



1980

The Child Protection
Center was established
following a Community
Needs Assessment by the
Junior League of Sarasota.
Initially provided only child
abuse intervention services
through the Child Protection
Team (CPT).

The Kid Kindness Program (KKP) began psychotherapy for children who exhibited early indications of aggressive behavior & to children who have been abused by other children.

1995

Court ordered Children & Families Supervised Visitation Program (CFSVP) began to facilitate visits between non-custodial parents & their children.



The Sexual Abuse Treatment Program (SATP) was developed to help children & families recover from the effects of child sexual abuse.





1992

The Personal Safety & Community Awareness Program (PSCA) was planned & service provisions began.

1991

The services of CPT & SATP were extended to children abused by a non-caregiver, a population previously unserved.



PREVENTION

Personal Safety and Community Awareness Program (PSCA)

PSCA provides primary abuse prevention education to children from preschool through high school. The program also facilitates workshops for their caregivers, childcare professionals, teachers, school board staff and the greater community. PSCA has over 20 workshops, such as Internet Safety, Sexual Abuse Prevention, and Anti-Bullying. The focus is the creation of a future in which children are empowered and educated, adults are aware and equipped, and our community is a safer place for children and families. INTERVENTION -

Child Protection Team (CPT)

CPT is a legislatively mandated program working in partnership with Child Protection Investigators of the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) and local law enforcement agencies in cases of children who are suspected victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse and neglect. This multidisciplinary program provides expertise in evaluating allegations of abuse and neglect, assessing risk factors, and providing recommendations for interventions to protect children. Services provided by CPT include forensic interviews, psychological and psychosocial assessments, forensic medical assessments and court testimony. CPT is the only provider authorized by the state to perform these functions in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties.

Children and Families Supervised Visitation Program (CFSVP)

CFSVP provides a safe place for children to interact with parents without the stress of being in the middle of a family argument, observing a parent who is impaired by substance abuse and without uncomfortable conversations that include adult topics. By accessing the CFSVP, the risk of violence to children will decrease. Ongoing parent and child contact, through supervised visitation, has been shown to be crucial to a child's mental health and ability to build a healthy relationship with the non-custodial parent. Over 50 Sarasota County citizens serve as CFSVP volunteers.

TREATMENT

Therapy Programs

Therapy Programs provide individual, family, and group therapy services to children in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. We serve children who have been physically & sexually abused, children exhibiting problematic sexual behaviors, and extend intervention services to the primary client's non-offending caregiver and siblings. The focus is to provide mental health support, intervention, and treatment to children and families experiencing crisis and trauma, as well as reduce child-on-child sexual abuse. Through effective trauma treatment, we restore the health, development, relationships, and the safety of children and families.



TED AND ETHNA WISHNIE, LEGACY DONORS

Time and again, Ted and Ethna Wishnie would find themselves driving past the Child Protection Center, saying "We've got to go in there! We've got to go in there!" While COVID restrictions forced their tour of the building to take place virtually, it did nothing to dampen the fire that was lit deep within the couple once they heard the mission against child abuse.

"We felt a burning in our hearts to get involved.

Since their introduction to CPC, the Wishnies have become firm supporters, becoming two of CPC's very first donors to pledge a Legacy Gift. Ted commented how making the gift was simple by adding CPC to their will. "We chose to give a Legacy Gift to help CPC continue their extraordinary work," he explained.
